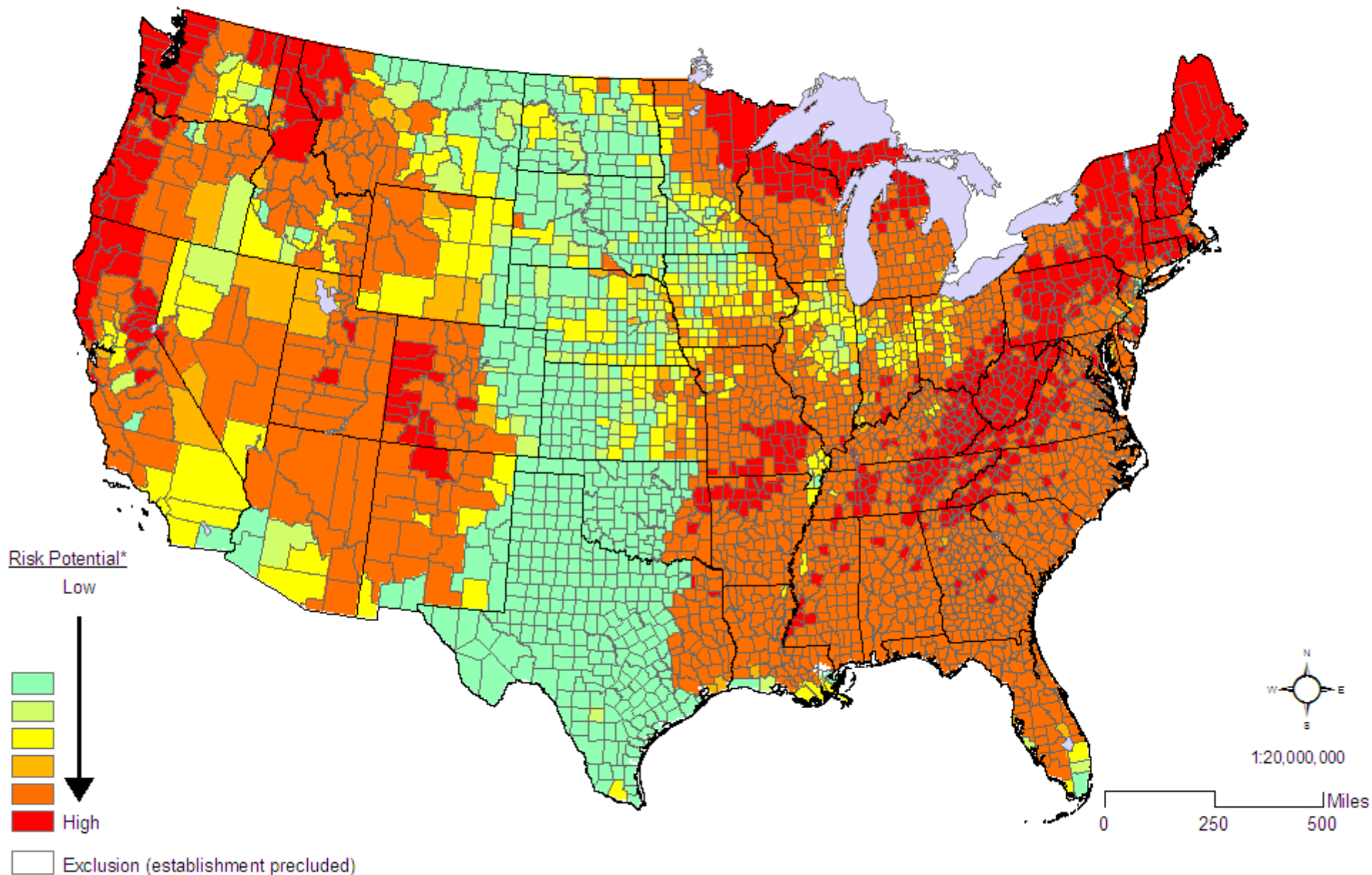


Risk Map

*The Risk map is a combination of the Host and NAPFFAST maps. A Risk map depicts with a relative scale, the potential areas that are unsuitable or highly suitable for growth and establishment. It is possible to directly compare values between maps of the same type (e.g. Risk to Risk).
